Proposed Federal Cuts Threaten Lifeline Programs for Older and Disabled Adults

A resolution passed by both the U.S. House and Senate opens the door to deep cuts to Medicaid and the Supplemental Nutritional Assistance Program (SNAP)—programs that older adults, people with disabilities, caregivers and families in Napa and Solano counties rely on every day. If enacted into law, the proposal would reduce \$880 billion from Medicaid and \$230 billion from SNAP.
